SC Johnson Top Consumer Packaged Goods Company to Make List

SC Johnson ranked 29th on FORTUNE's annual "100 Best Companies to Work For" list, which appeared in the January 20, 2003 issue. SC Johnson is the highest ranked consumer packaged goods company to make the list, as well as the top Wisconsin-based company.

The company is one of only ten on the list featured in a write-up within FORTUNE along with a photo of long-tenured employees. One of those employees, Jane Hutterly, came to SC Johnson for an interview 23 years ago and has reportedly never looked back. "I was given so much opportunity," said Hutterly, who is now Senior Vice President for Worldwide Corporate Affairs.

SC Johnson is also one of only twelve companies to appear on both the FORTUNE 100 Best and the FORTUNE 50 Best Companies for Minorities in 2002.

Family owned and managed, SC Johnson has an excellent retention rate—92 percent in 2002, or three percent higher than the reported rates for "best employers." In fact, one-third of the company's employees have worked at SC Johnson for over 20 years. Since it was founded in 1886, SC Johnson has never had a layoff. Its profit sharing plan dates back to 1917.

More than 1,000 firms were considered for FORTUNE's list. A random sample of employees were surveyed from 269 candidate companies. Over 40,000 employees responded to the survey, which was created by the Great Places to Work Institute. Nearly half of those surveyed provided additional written comments. Companies also completed a questionnaire describing their HR policies and workplace culture. In selecting the top 100 companies, the greatest weight was placed on employee responses—two-thirds of the total.

Topping this year's list for the second year in a row is Edward Jones, a stockbroker headquartered in St. Louis. At number two, also for the second year in a row, is the Container Store, a Texas retailer. Alston & Bird, an Atlanta law firm; Xilinx, a San Jose semiconductor manufacturer; and Adobe, the Silicon Valley software company,
